KINSHIP CARE RESPITE PROGRAM

Seniors who are full time caregivers are faced with many challenges when taking care of children. It is important for caregivers to focus on parenting, but also to remember to take care of their own needs.

The Kinship Care Respite Program is a resource offered through the Tri County Office on Aging. The purpose of the Kinship Care Respite Program is to give the full time caregiver over 55 a break from their parenting responsibilities.



What is the Kinship Care Respite Program?

The Kinship Care Respite Program was developed to provide rest, relief and a break from everyday caregiving. This program will assist the full time caregiver by helping to arrange and pay for an activity for their child to attend. Activities may include:

- Day Care
- Sports camp
- Summer class
- Extra-curricular activities



The goal of the Kinship Care Respite Program is to provide the caregiver with a break from the responsibilities of the daily routine of care for a child.

Who is Eligible to Participate in this Program?

Kinship caregivers 55 years of age or older who live in Clinton, Eaton and Ingham Counties are eligible to participate. The program is intended to assist senior caregivers caring for a child or children eighteen years of age or younger.



How Much Does this Program Cost?

There is no cost to eligible caregivers in the Tri-County Area. The program is funded by the Federal Older Americans Act grant provided to Tri-County Office on Aging through the Michigan Aging and Adult Services Agency.
